**Match Reports**

**RBHS 1<sup>ST</sup> V SACS 20/20**

The 1<sup>st</sup> X1 recorded a comfortable 47 run victory against SACS at SACS on Tuesday afternoon. Winning the toss, Rondebosch elected to bat and were soon in trouble when Brendan Rodgers managed to remove

three of the top order in quick succession. Hilio de Abreu and Taariq Chiektey set about restoring the innings with some smart running between wickets and taking advantage of whatever bad deliveries were on offer. Shortly after the pair had passed the 50 partnership mark, De Abreu departed and Zubayr Hamza joined Taariq who by now was in belligerent form. These two enjoyed a 76 run partnership of 62 balls and were both unbeaten at the end of the innings enabling Rondebosch to set a target of 146. Taariq's 83 not out came off just 55 balls and included 9 fours and 2 sixes. SACS never managed to get going in the face of disciplined bowling and lost wickets at regular intervals. Alex Mather (3 for 13) was the pick of the bowlers but it was a good all-round effort from the bowlers, backed up by some fine fielding that ensured that SACS ended their innings on 98 for 9.

### **RBHS 1<sup>st</sup> v Pinelands**

Losing the toss was disappointing as the batsman were hoping to enjoy some time at the crease at Pinelands on Saturday. Pinelands elected to bat and although they made a steady enough start, the introduction of spin from both ends proved to be their downfall, and the hosts capitulated from 43 for 2 to 87 all out. Jaco Zeeman bowled consistently into a strong wind and his patience and perseverance was richly rewarded with fine figures of 5 for 22 off 14 overs. Hilio de Abreu's 3 for 28 was also noteworthy. An awkward 16 minute session before lunch, saw both Hayes van der Berg and Matthew Norris depart to be 19 for 2 at the break. Keagan Smith and Hilio de Abreu steadied the ship, before Keagan got out in unfortunate circumstances and then Hilio (31) perished just before the winning target was reached. Taariq finished off the run chase in style to end with 18 not out in a comfortable 6 wicket win.

### **RBHS U17 v Wiltshire**

Touring sides always provide a good opportunity to get in extra match practice and an under 17 side took on the tourists on Sunday. We again lost the toss and Wiltshire decided to bat. The bowlers made life difficult for the visitors and had we not spilled a few catchable chances we may well have bowled them out for a lot less than the 136 that they eventually achieved. Wickets were spread around amongst the bowlers, with Kay Skovgaard-Peterson impressing with a lively spell. Our run chase proceeded smoothly despite the early loss of Devon van Rensburg. Keagan Smith and Hayes van der Berg were patient to begin with, happy to rotate the strike and pick of the odd bad ball. Once they were set, Hayes in particular, took the attack to the bowlers. Keagan departed shortly before the target was reached for 43, but Hayes went all the way to the end to finish with a fluent 83 not out to ensure that Rondebosch recorded an 8 wicket victory.
