## U19A 1st Team vs SACS

Rondebosch were determined to reverse the defeat suffered in the 1<sup>st</sup> term when they met SACS at Rondebosch on Saturday. SACS won the toss and surprisingly elected to bat first on a wicket that had been covered during the week due to the intermittent rain. The Bosch bowlers were not able to take full advantage of the overhead conditions and Raa (37 off 105 balls) and Engel (38 off 119 balls) progressed the SACS innings after the early loss of Levetan. These two were however not able to dominate an attack that proved miserly - between the 10<sup>th</sup> and 38<sup>th</sup> over SACS could only score 41 runs as Hilio de Abreu and Dewald Keulder combined to frustrate the SACS batters. The pressure began to tell in the latter stages of the innings as the batsmen were forced to try to accelerate the scoring rate with the compulsory declaration after 65 overs drawing nearer. Williams (46 of 69 balls) played a lone hand in this regard as none of the lower order could managed to occupy the crease for any length of time with De Abreu ( 6 for 41) and Keulder (3 for 24) ensuring that SACS were bowled out for 152 in the 62<sup>nd</sup> over.

The Bosch reply started in eventful fashion with the top order seemingly being intent on an early afternoon. Injudicious shot selection coupled with some aggressive bowling resulted in the game being delicately poised with the hosts on 61 for 4. Keulder joined De Abreu and these two continued to take the attack to the SACS bowlers, but with more success than their predecessors. De Abreu was particularly belligerent combing aggressive running between wickets with some attacking strokeplay. He eventually departed for 58 off just 46 balls with just 11 runs still required for victory. The target was reached without further loss with Keulder ending on 33 not out again making a mockery of the selectors decision to omit him from the provincial side.

A satisfying 5 wicket victory continues the turnaround in fortunes for an ever improving Bosch team.

## Batting – Grant Morgan

A quality necessary to survive the toughest conditions; deal with the most extreme pressure situations; and face up to your fears.

### C. Bravery/Courage

Batting requires both physical and mental bravery. It requires the courage to deal with the threat posed by the hard ball to your physical safety. It requires the courage to deal with extreme pace, extreme spin, extreme accuracy, extreme swing and extreme pressure. It requires the courage to deal with failure; verbal abuse from the opposition; expectations from fans, team-mates and loved ones; making a living from a skill where not everything can be controlled by you; a bad patch can change your standard of living  
What are the fundamentals of bravery and courage in batting?

#### 1. Dealing with physical intimidation

2. Dealing with pressure built by extreme skills of the opposition bowlers
3. Dealing with pressure from opposition (verbally), fans, loved ones and team-mates
4. Dealing with failure and the unpredictability of batting

#### 1. Dealing with Physical intimidation

You will never be a good or great batsman if you are scared of the ball. Many tail-enders give their wicket away due to the fear of being physically hurt. The courage to deal with this threat is a core characteristic a batsman needs.

#### 2. Dealing with pressure built by the skills of the bowlers

Courage is needed to deal with the skills of the opposition bowlers. It is the brave man who makes the correct decision at the right time under pressure. Often it is only this characteristic that separates the great batsmen from the ordinary ones. The transferring of pressure onto the bowlers is a hallmark of good batting. There is a time to hold the game and a time to move it forward. The ability to sense and anticipate these moments is one of the hidden gifts a great batsman will possess.

#### 3. Dealing with pressure from opposition (verbally), fans, loved ones and team mates

Many sports or disciplines in sport are over in a short time period. Batting can last for a while and players must deal with pressure from various quarters. A team innings, especially in a 4 or 5 day match, can take a day or two and allows for a lot of reflection time. It takes courage to deal with setbacks one has suffered.

#### 4. Dealing with failure and the unpredictability of batting

Batting is a failing art. By saying that I mean that more often than not, you may not achieve your ultimate score and dealing with this, plays a big role in your success in the long term as a batsman. It takes courage and bravery to try and master the mental challenges that batting throws at you. A good tip is to make your 'highs' lower and your 'lows' higher and function more around the mean. You are not always in control of your own destiny as a batsman, accept that and make peace with it.

And last, but by no means least...

## D. Fitness

Fitness is vital to success in any sport or discipline within a sport. Batting is no different. Fitness helps concentration which in turn helps so many other things. The discipline and routines linked to building fitness are magically linked to making runs

# IMPROVE YOUR GAME

RYAN MARON ON TAKING A HIGH CATCH IN THE OUTFIELD

### HAND POSITION

The most important aspect regarding the hands when taking a catch is to make sure they are not too low. It is important to catch the ball with your hands high and in line with your eyes. A fielder can secure the ball by bringing it into his chest.

### BODY POSITION

Once you have reached the position you are comfortable in to take a catch, keep your body stable and always try to take the catch in front of you rather than to your left or right. Try to stay on your feet unless a dive is required. You must also allow for the wind and either move forward or backward, depending on the position of the ball.

### FEET POSITION

When attempting a high catch it is important that your feet are in a stable position, about shoulder length apart. This allows you to be steady and more in control when taking the catch.

### HEAD POSITION

Your eyes must watch the ball all the way into your hands until the catch has been successfully completed. Keep your head steady and watch the ball all the way into your hands.



### TIP

➤ The best way to improve your catching ability is to practise as often as possible. Start off with more simple high catches and move onto higher and more testing catches.
