Duo's 310 run fest is one for the books

CITY teenage batsmen Matthew Christensen and Tayo Walbrugh set what could be a local record by helping their side compile 486/1 in 50 overs in Rondebosch over the weekend.

Christensen, 14, hit 224 not out off 160 balls and his Rondebosch Boys' High under-14A teammate, Tayo Walbrugh, 14, smashed 152 off 81 balls, as their team thrashed visiting Boland Landbou by 441 runs.

Systematic records are not kept for junior cricket, but sources said many of the statistical feats from the match are the best in living memory.

Western Province Cricket Association amateur cricket boss Nabeal Dien said that in his 15 years in the sport he could not remember a partnership as big as the 310 runs the duo put on for the second wicket.

Christensen smashed 25 fours and 11 sixes against the Boland Landbou attack, while Walbrugh wreaked havoc with 15 fours and nine sixes.

Christensen was part of the

winter training group for the WP under-15 side, but was not selected for the final squad

named this week.

Rondebosch continued their winning ways on Friday night at Bergvliet against SACS. SACS won the toss and batted first on a wicket that was never going to be conducive to strokeplay. It was a war of attrition with no batsman being able to dominate in the face of some tight bowling. SACS would have felt that their total of 95 was never going to be enough in the allotted 20 overs.

The Bosch innings took on a similar character to that of their opponents with no batsman looking comfortable at the crease. Bosch however, showed more "street smart" than their counterparts with the batsmen constantly stealing singles rather than looking for the boundary balls. This eventually proved the difference between the two teams as Michael Sparkman and Zubayr Hamza combined well at the end to steer Rondebosch to a 5 wicket triumph.

Paul Roos won the toss and chose to send Rondebosch into bat on a warm day in Stellenbosch on Saturday.

Aidan Morris and Hayes van der Berg began solidly for the visitors before a needless run out eventuated in the dismissal of van der Berg with the total on 48.

Two further wickets before the drinks break including Morris for a well-played 47, saw the game evenly balanced with Bosch on 76 for 3. Greg Scott and captain Hilio de Abreu negotiated a difficult period after the break and then began to score freely. These two enjoyed a 74 run partnership before Scott was dismissed.

Another two wickets saw Rondebosch at 180 for 6 and again in danger of falling short of an imposing total. Matthew Steel was then joined by Keagan Smith and these two rotated strike well, and then began to take the attack to a tiring Paul Roos attack to record a 74 run partnership of 80 balls. Matthew Steel (38) fell in the search for quick runs for the declaration and Keagan was left on 38 not out as Rondebosch declared on 255 for 7 after 68 overs.

The home team started badly with some loose shot and poor running between wickets contributing to their own downfall. At 107 for 8 with some 25 overs remaining in the day the cause looked a lost one. Pieterse and Scholtz had other ideas though and these two mixed some aggressive shot-making with resolute defence to frustrate the visitors.

At the end of the 20th over of the last hour, Paul Roos thought that the game had been saved by this heroic partnership, however they had not accounted for the fact that there were still 3 minutes left in the day's play and the last over proved costly as first Pieterse (95) fell, caught on the boundary trying to reach his century, and then with two balls remaining in the day's play, de Abreu ended Scholtz's stubborn resistance having him caught close to the bat to give Rondebosch a thrilling 60 run victory.

It was a great game of cricket where the momentum ebbed and flowed constantly throughout the day, and both teams fought right up to the very end.

Batting - Grant Morgan

Last week we had a look at technique and what vital role it plays in our game. Today we focus on an aspect which is as important (if not more so!) as having a good technique.

B. Concentration

This one word encompasses all the mental areas related to batting. Batting takes time and thus requires great concentration and intense focus. Decisions often have to be made in a split second and thus the correct shot selection made as a result of good concentration will ultimately determine a batsman's success. The mere nature of batting often creates pre-meditation. Players who minimize these urges are more successful.

Patience is a great virtue which falls under the banner of concentration.

What are the fundamentals of concentration in batting?

1. Patience
2. Shot selection
3. Avoid pre-meditation where possible
4. Find a recipe that works and stick to it

1. Patience

It takes concentration to have patience and patience to make runs - even in 20/20 and even if you are in a hurry. Where do you think the saying 'You have more time than you think' comes from!

2. Shot Selection

It takes concentration to build and execute good shot selection. Shot selection is more important than the talent you possess to execute the shots.

3. Avoid pre-meditation where possible

Many batsmen have a little devil on their shoulder that creates havoc in their minds. Pre-meditation is sometimes necessary, but some batsmen spend too much time in this state. Pre-meditation kills focus and kills concentration.

4. Find a recipe that works and stick to it

It requires concentration and time to build a recipe. It takes the same 2 characteristics to stick to it. Recipes can flop, but they work more often than not and they give us direction.

All the top batsmen in the game have their recipe for success. They all bat in their own way and don't try to copy others. It is vital to be comfortable with your own game and do what works for you. Staying in the moment and concentrating on the now allows you to be more focused

and ultimately more successful.

COACHING CORNER



IMPROVE YOUR GAME

RYAN MARON ON TAKING A HIGH CATCH IN THE OUTFIELD

HAND POSITION

The most important aspect regarding the hands when taking a catch is to make sure they are not too low. It is important to catch the ball with your hands high and in line with your eyes. A fielder can secure the ball by bringing it into his chest.

BODY POSITION

Once you have reached the position you are comfortable in to take a catch, keep your body stable and always try to take the catch in front of you rather than to your left or right. Try to stay on your feet unless a dive is required. You must also allow for the wind and either move forward or backward, depending on the position of the ball.

FEET POSITION

When attempting a high catch it is important that your feet are in a stable position, about shoulder length apart. This allows you to be steady and more in control when taking the catch.

HEAD POSITION

Your eyes must watch the ball all the way into your hands until the catch has been successfully completed. Keep your head steady and watch the ball all the way into your hands.



TIP

➤ The best way to improve your catching ability is to practise as often as possible. Start off with more simple high catches and move onto higher and more testing catches.
