RBHS 1st v SACS 20/20

The annual Edusport 20/20 competition got underway on Friday in cold and wet conditions at Bergvliet. After winning the toss the Bosch innings followed a stop/start pattern, not because of the weather, but rather because none of the batters managed to push on to a big score and the regular loss of wickets prevented us from putting a really big score on the board. Keagan Smith, Hayes van der Berg and Hilio de Abreu all made useful contributions in getting Bosch to 131 for 6 after the allotted 20 overs. We felt that the score was defendable on a wicket that provided some assistance for the seamers and tight spells up front meant that at the end of the powerplay SACS were just 20-1. Jack Newby then started to up the rate for SACS, but after Williams departed for 20, none of the other batters was able to stay with him and after he departed for 62 the result was not really in doubt with Bosch winning by 12 runs. The seamers all returned impressive figures with Kay Skovgaard-Petersen's 2 for 12 in 4 being the best. Rondebosch will be hoping to record their 6<sup>th</sup> consecutive victory against SACS in three weeks time!

RBHS 1st v Boland Landbou

Bosch took a slight gamble on winning the toss in overcast conditions to bat first, hoping to give the top order a good bat. After a little wobble at the start of the innings, the gamble paid off as first Hayes van der Berg and Hilio de Abreu and then Taariq Chiecktey and Zubayr Hamza combined in partnerships that showed just why they all have been included in the Provincial age group teams. Van der Berg and De Abreu came together with the score on 8 for 2 and they went about building a partnership with a combination of judicious running between wickets and some decisive boundary hitting. The pair took the score on to 112 before De Abreu departed

for a fluent 65 (65 balls 8 x 4, 2 x 6). Van der Berg was next to go shortly after reaching his 50 (87 balls 6 x 4, 1 x 6) which set the stage for Chiecktey and Hamza. A partnership of 139 off just 129 balls is indicative of the freedom that these two played with. After initially setting themselves at the crease, they began to score all around the wicket, displaying their full array of shot-making ability. 57 runs came off the last 5 overs of the innings allowing Bosch to declare on 276 for 4 after 53 overs. Taariq's 72 not out came off 80 balls (8 x 4, 3 x 6) with Zubayr ending on 61 not out of 67 balls (12 x 4). After some initial dogged resistance from the visitors' openers, Stoffberg and Harris, wickets began to fall regularly with all the bowlers getting in on the wicket-taking. Some good catching assisted the bowlers and Boland Landbou were eventually dismissed for 121 in the 48<sup>th</sup> over resulting in a 155 run victory for Bosch, which stands them in good stead for two tough fixtures next weekend.

The U15B's played host to Boland Lanbou on Wednesday in a 20/20 match on Meadow 'B'

RBHS won the toss and decided to make first use of the wicket. Jordan Corfe was dismissed early but Matthew Jeffrey and Shaun Sorour steadied the ship before Jeffrey played a loose shot to lose his wicket.

Sorour followed shortly after pulling a long hop straight to square leg and with the score on 71, RBHS lost

their 4<sup>th</sup> wicket being Dylan McEwan. With Aidan Child and Dean Tucker at the wicket, they put took advantage of some loose bowling by putting the bad ball away. Child and Tucker put on an unbeaten partnership of 105. Dean Tucker ended up on 45\* and Aidan Child was unlucky to finish on 49\* but the pair can be pleased with the job they did by getting the team to 176 of our allotted 20 overs.

We started of well with the ball picking up some early wickets. Ewald Rist then entered the attack and picked up two wickets in one over leaving Boland Landbou reeling at 4 for 29. Rist ended up with figures of 3/3 in 4 overs. Boland Landbou never recovered from this position and were bowled out for 52 in the 19<sup>th</sup> over.

A good start to the second half of the season for the U15B's but the opposition will surely get tougher in the coming weeks. Batsmen are going to need to apply themselves at the crease and the intensity in the field will need to be raised if we are to achieve the goals we set ourselves.
