
### Lost or Mislaid - Please Help

We started badly with the ball gifting the accomplished pair of Beddingham and Edmeades with far too many boundary balls, which allowed the opening pair to score freely without any pressure. Hayes van der Berg and later Michael Sparkman did good jobs with the ball to pull it back a little, but with wickets in hand at the end, Wynberg finished strongly to score 124, probably 20 runs too many under the circumstances.

Our innings started badly with the top order succumbing to disciplined bowling and some poor shot selection. A brief recovery from the middle order never really looked like putting us in a winning position and eventually we were bowled out still 48 runs shy of the target.

of the top order was not as successful, succumbing to some indifferent shots and an unfortunate run out. Michael Sparkman came to the crease in the 23<sup>rd</sup> over and made good use of time remaining. He mixed aggression with some cautious defence, as the situation required, and was eventually out in the last over in the quest for quick runs. He scored 67 off 80 balls and with good contributions from Drew Matthews (29) and Jaco Zeeman (18 not out) managed to take Bosch to a good total of 258 for 8 after our allotted 50 overs.

The Bergvliet run chase never got underway as our opening bowlers did not repeat Monday's mistakes. First Drew Matthews (3 for 20) and then Dewald Keulder (3 for 5) picked up wickets regularly to have the hosts reeling at 40 for 7. The tail enders stuck around for a while, but eventually Bergvliet were dismissed for 88, giving Rondebosch a satisfying 170 run victory.
